International Sustainability Diploma

It's a busy time of year for the International Sustainability Diploma, with our first cohort of students reaching the end of their Diploma course and the second cohort beginning. The qualification is recognised by UCAS and we wish all our students well as they progress to the next stage of learning and life. We are delighted that the number of schools across Scotland offering the qualification is set to double in the 2025-26 session and look forward to working with them all.



New Qualification at Level 5

Building on the experience of the Diploma, FIDA is also now pleased to introduce a new qualification, the International Sustainability Certificate at SCQF Level 5. This is the result of a rigorous credit-rating process conducted by our academic partner, Glasgow Clyde College. It responds to demand from teachers who feel there would be benefit in introducing project-based learning at an earlier stage. We are excited to take this forward with schools in the 2025-26 session.

Junior 1 Wildlife Welcome Here Project



Here at Dollar Academy, our entire Junior 1 (Primary 6) year group has just completed a year-long FIDA project investigating threats to local wildlife and designing their own solutions. Their work couldn't be more relevant, as the UN's Goal of the Month for May was Life on Land. From 'habitat in a bag' kits for hedgehog protection to high-tech colour-sensing squirrel-feeders that would discern red squirrels from grey, their ideas were as impressive as they were innovative.

UNSDG - Goal of the Month

SDG 15 - Life on Land: Forests, biodiversity and land are under growing pressure from human activity. As of 2024, forest loss continues at alarming rates, with over 10 million hectares disappearing annually. Only 15% of land globally is under protection, while desertification and soil degradation threaten the livelihoods of over 3.2 billion people. Biodiversity is declining, with one million species at risk of extinction. Achieving Goal 15 requires urgent restoration of degraded land, halting deforestation, and conserving biodiversity across ecosystems.
