2025/26 Learner survey results

"I want to make a difference in my community, even if that is marginal, anything counts"

As the International Sustainability Diploma enters its second year, now spanning 12 schools across Scotland, we asked pupils to share their early impressions. Their responses were overwhelmingly positive and full of enthusiasm for what lies ahead.

In brief, students chose the Diploma primarily for their interest in sustainability (68%) and skills development (55%), with many attracted by its different learning style. Significantly, 85% rated the qualification as "Important" or "Very Important" for their future pathways.

A key finding relates to assessment preferences. While only 25% felt traditional exams show their abilities "very well," an impressive 88% responded positively to the portfolio-based approach. As one student noted: "Time and thinking is much more representative - not just what you can remember in a few hours."

Students are particularly keen to develop project work, public speaking, and critical thinking skills. With 75% having no concerns about the course, learners are clearly enthusiastic about this alternative approach to sustainability education.

We look forward to surveying the students again at the end of the year to see how far they've come!
